Encouraging the pupils to bring in and celebrate their personal achievements is key and we would like to start encouraging this further in school.

Learning means the world curriculum – Foundation Stage

In FS1 we have loved our topic "Let's Play". We drew our favourite toys, made a list of food to have a teddy bears' picnic and designed our own Mr Potato Heads. We especially enjoyed construction week where we explored Lego to see how many different models with could make. This half term we have also looked at healthy foods, how to make toys move and old and new toys. We have been very busy indeed!



In FS2 our themed unit is 'Let's Play' like in Fs1. We have had so much fun making toys and games to play and share with our friends. The children were so resilient when designing and making puppets to play with. They also enjoyed talking about and sharing some of their own toys from home.

 What a great start to the summer term for Y3! The children have loved learning all things Greece in their Athens V Sparta topic and they are super excited about their Greek food tasting day on Friday! As mathematicians, Y3 have developed their knowledge about fractions (a favourite topic in our class!) and money. Miss Bennett is always so proud of how hard the children work - it is clear to see that they are definitely getting ready for Y4! 	Year 4 have thoroughly been enjoying our current Learning Means the World Top, Law and Order. We have been exploring rules, consequences and exploring democracy this half term in different settings. In our art lesson we discussed the 'rule of three' and how to apply it in their own artwork when sketching from a chosen image. Everyone produced a lovely piece of art and took pride in what they had produced.	
Class 7- Our Speech and Language resource- Mrs Martin- Chambers		

The children have loved our latest theme Land Ahoy! We have been on a sound walk for science and have discussed being responsible in PSHE. The children particularly enjoyed learning a pirate themed song and adding music using a range of musical instruments. Another favourite was making boats and testing them, the children decided whether to pull or push their boats to make them move!



Year 5- Miss Curle

This term class 5 have loved learning all about global warming, pollution and the environment. They have shown a great passion for the planet and really been engaged with the ways we can all make a difference. We absolutely loved our trip to Magna and the children did the school and Miss Curle extremely proud! The children have written some incredible pieces of work in their English and Miss Curle is so proud of

how hard they have worked. Keep it up year 5!





Year 6- Mr Brookes

This half-term Y6 have entered the 'War of the Worlds', which has looked at wars: past and present. In PSCHE, they have considered differing points of view to fighting in a war. They are currently designing posters emphasising the importance of letting children be children (and not soldiers). In textiles, they have made poppies from felt and in music listened to some genres of song that were inspired by war. As well as all this, they have completed their SATs! They worked really well over SATs week and have done themselves proud!

Rewarding success

Celebrating our pupils and their achievements is really important to us here in school and we are constantly thinking of ways in which we can reward and recognise successes. We hope that your children are telling you about what happens in school, if not, here are our rewards!

Daily Dojo points awarded for showing the school values, following school rules and exemplifying our motto. Headteacher stickers/ certificates- I pop into classes or children are sent especially to showcase their learning Raffle tickets- one per week across school given for the most Dojos in a week and collected in my office (3 are then drawn at random for a book prize)

Sporting Superstar- is given by Mr Smith for a child demonstrating effort in PE that week in school or an achievement out of school

Lunchtime Lovely and Wraparound Wonder - a child is chosen by our lunchtime supervisors, Cook Mrs Bradshaw and kitchen staff or Wraparound staff for trying new foods, tidying their table, being polite and helpful etc.. Values Champion- each week our staff including Mrs Hayes and Mr Hall in our office discuss the class who have 'made a difference' and they then can spin the wheel to win extra break, a movie clip/ cartoon, chance to play on the outdoor gym or creative time! They then get to keep our teddy Vinnie for the week! We even have a Staff Values Champion!

Star of the Week- each teacher chooses a child from their class and each term Pupil of the term.

Times Tables Rockstars- Mr Bishop keeps an eye on TTR and each week chooses a different category; fastest speed, biggest improvement etc. and Mrs Divit chooses the Spelling Shed Stars based on improvements made. Each teacher rewards the efforts in racing across the world with the Maths passports and our newest rewards are nominated by the children themselves supported by Miss Curle. Our **Respect Rangers** are children spotted always being respectful and kind in school; it's been lovely to hear their reasons why some children have been chosen. Moving forwards, we want to celebrate successes and achievements outside school and will be hosting a Superstars assembly so children can tell their peers all about their successes if they wish.
