

Year 6 Expectations

As role models for the rest of the school, Y6 will always be **ready**, **respectful**, **safe**. This includes in class, at assembly times and outside at breaks and lunchtimes. They are also given rewards (star of the week, prefect stars, lunchtime lovely, sporting superstar, dojos, raffle tickets, ...) for following our school values without reminder: resilience, aspiration, respect, kindness, teamwork.

Prefects

In Y6, our children are given the opportunity to become prefects and, for the elected ones (chosen by staff), Head Pupils. To earn a prefect badge, the children must be excellent role models for the younger children in school and always give 100% effort to their learning. At the end of every week, if they have been good role models, both inside school and in the playground, and applied themselves to their learning (including completing any homework tasks set), they will receive a prefect star. Additional prefect stars will be awarded for 15 dojos (within a week) and every time a certificate is awarded to them in assembly. After they have achieved 15 prefect stars, the children can apply to become a prefect and receive their prefect badge.

The children are also asked to take on additional responsibilities in school (playground leaders, reading with KS1 children, ...). At the end of the year, all prefects will get to attend the prefect reward day – last year held at Gullivers'.



What to bring to school each day:

Learning Log

Children should bring their learning log to school each day. This has key information for supporting them independently in their learning. Here is where they should record the times they have read (this should be at least four sessions of 20 minutes) – whether that be to themselves or an adult. They may also bring their own reading book from home if they wish to although it is unlikely that they will get time to read it during learning time.

Water Bottles

Every child should bring a water bottle each day. This can easily be filled in the classroom at any time or from the drink dispenser at break or lunch. Children's water bottles will be allowed on their desks if they have a secure cap. During certain lessons they made need to move them to the side of the classroom.

A Healthy Snack

As it is a long time from dropping your child off until lunchtime (at least four hours!), please provide your child with a healthy snack for breaktime.

PE Kits

PE will usually take place on a Thursday afternoon, with Mr Smith. However, children need to have their PE kit in school all week. Please make sure PE kits and all clothes, which could be removed, are labelled.

Pencil Cases

Over the course of the year, we are allowing to children to bring in (smallish) pencil cases, containing only the materials needed for learning (pencil, rubbers, rulers, pencil crayons). This is to get them prepared for having to do the same when entering Year Seven.
