The Very Hungry Caterpillar By Eric Carle	Minibeasts Growth Counting	The book introduces early learning concepts like counting, colours, and days of the week. It also teaches about metamorphosis and healthy eating habits.
Handa's Surprise By Eileen Browne	Culture Friendship	The book shows people and places with different cultures. It has predictable and patterned language.
The Three Billy Goats Gruff My fairy-tale time By Miles Kelly	Greed Friendship Bravery	The story can inspire children to be strong and brave in any situation.
Supertato, Veggies Assemble By Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet	Imagination Healthy eating	A good story to link with food topic and superheroes.
